### What You Should Know About Door-to-Door Solicitors

A Shoreline municipal ordinance requires for-profit solicitors and "Master Solicitors" who employ them to file a written application for a license with the Shoreline City Clerk and carry the license at all times when soliciting or canvassing. Solicitors must produce the license when requested by persons being solicited, police or City officials.

The following are **exempt** from the license requirements: Tax-exempt non-profit organizations who have filed a current 501(C)3 with the City Clerk; Newspaper deliverers; Political candidates, campaign workers and political committees soliciting signatures of registered voters; and Sales people who solicit businesses.

Below are a few crime prevention tips to safeguard yourself and your home from unscrupulous door-to-door solicitors:

- Always ask solicitors for identification to verify what company they are working for. If they refuse, ask them to leave.
- Ask to see their license from the City of Shoreline. If they do not have one, ask them to leave.
- If you encounter a solicitor who becomes aggressive or won't take "no" for an answer, ask them to leave, shut the door and **call 911**.
- Never invite a solicitor into your home. You can say "no thank you" without opening the door.

Note: The for-profit license is approximately 3.5" x 6", laminated, and includes a license number, City Logo & Seal, photo of the person, and the City Clerk's signature, and must be carried by the solicitor.

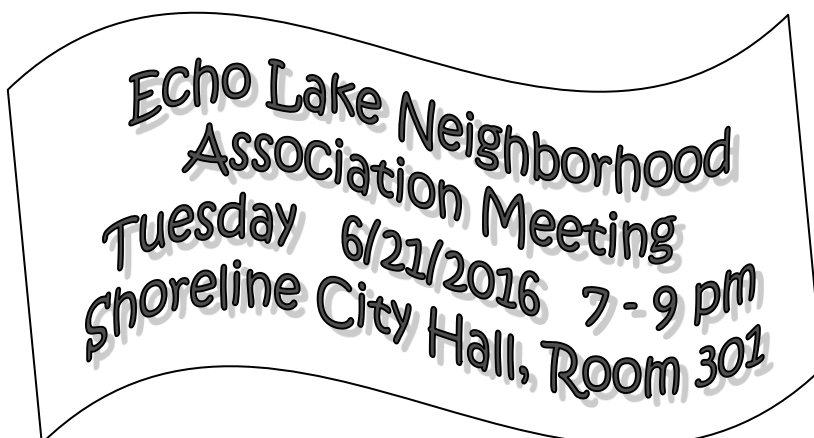
